



### **Generational Opportunity**



#### Federal, State, & Local Broadband Funding

- American Rescue Plan
  - State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (States & localities) \$350 billion
  - Capital Projects Fund (States & U.S. Treasury) \$10 billion
- Infrastructure Investment & Jobs Act
  - Broadband Equity, Access and Deployment Program (NTIA/States) \$42.5 billion
  - Broadband Affordable Connectivity Program (FCC) \$14.2 billion
  - **Digital Equity and Inclusion Grants** (NTIA) \$2.75 billion over five years
  - Middle Mile Broadband Deployment Grants (NTIA) \$1 billion
  - USDA ReConnect & Broadband Program (USDA/RUS) \$2 billion
- Connect IL Grant Program
  - \$400 million
  - Pending BEAD allocation




#### **Helping households connect**


Jo-Carroll Energy, with its Sand Prairie internet service, has been approved by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) as a provider for the Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) a new longer-term program that replaced the Emergency Broadband Benefit Program on December 31, 2021 to help lower the cost of high-speed internet to eligible households in our area.

The program will continue to help households struggling to pay for internet service during the pandemic. This new benefit will connect eligible households to jobs, critical healthcare services, and virtual classrooms. The Affordable Connectivity Program will provide an **on-bill credit of \$30 per month towards broadband service for qualifying households**.

Essentially 'future proof' pending near-term bandwidth demand increases and use cases






Both Upload and Download Speeds are Increasing >30% Annually


